Sunday is the first day of EngFrosh '98, so get ready to meet your fellow 'geers and develop your engineering pride! We'll meet at noon in the MacKenzie Engineering Quad. Once you've picked up your Frosh and drafting kits, you'll meet with your pre-determined Frosh group for some get-to-know-you / teambuilding games.

Once you've gotten to know your group a little better, an EngFrosh celebrity will lead you on the traditional rope tour. The tour gives Frosh a brief history of Carleton University and an introduction to the campus and the engineering buildings.



You'll be led through the buildings where the majority of your classes will take place: these include MacKenzie Engineering, the Minto Centre, the drafting labs, Tory (the "Egg"), and Dunton Tower.



Dinner will be provided in the MacKenzie Quad, and then some Engineering student groups, clubs, and societies (like the mini-Baja team, shown here) will present information to the Frosh groups. Other groups will include the Carleton Student Engineering Society (CSES), the EngSoc Project, the Mech & Aero Society, the Great Northern Concrete Toboggan Race teams, the Formula SAE Design team, and Virtual Ventures. Extracurricular activities have been described by our Dean as a "parallel learning environment," where we can apply theory learned in class to amazing projects. You can only take so much before you're dying to go out and tear up the track!



The bus tour of Ottawa will start at about 6:30 PM. The tour leads Frosh through the picturesque city of Ottawa on double decker buses. We'll end our tour in the Market, where the festivities will begin. Starting at 12:30 AM, Frosh will be bused back to the Quad in half-hour intervals to catch some well-needed rest.



MONDAY, SEPT. 7

At 10 AM on Monday, a special Women in Science and Engineering (WISE) workshop will be offered. All female Frosh are encouraged to attend this free event. Speakers will include recent Carleton University Engineering graduates, and representatives from the Faculty of Engineering.

Monday's activities emphasize group bonding and unity. Frosh will meet at noon in the MacKenzie Engineering Quad. You should provide your own lunch. Then, we'll head over to the MacKenzie Engineering Field for "Will's Games".



"Will's Games" is a collection of initiative tasks designed to promote cohesion and spirit within the groups. Much like the classroom, "Will's Games" challenge you to work under pressure in a team atmosphere. One of the challenges presented at "Will's Games" is the VolleyBall Net event, in which groups must cross over a fully-raised volleyball net without ever touching the net itself. Amazingly, in 1997 an entire team of 40 Frosh, including one individual in a wheelchair, cleared the net. Another challenge that is faced by groups during the day's events: holding a five-tiered human pyramid long enough to get a good photo!

"Will's Games" will wrap up about 6 PM, with the presentation of prizes to the groups who achieved the highest scores and fastest times. Groups will then head off to their individual party place for dinner and Group Night.



Group Night is organized by the Leader and Facils of your group, and they'll provide transportation to and from Group Night. You will be given coveralls in your Frosh kit, and Group Night is an opportunity to decorate them with your group's theme. The coveralls are an awesome way to show off your Engineering pride!

Group night is always a blast; some activities in the past have included dying the Frosh purple, pool parties, visiting other universities, and other wild events.



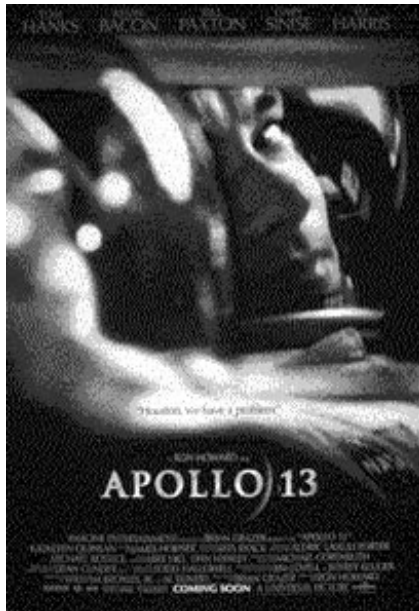
TUESDAY, SEPT. 8

Tuesday brings your academic orientation to Carleton University Engineering. Professor Don Bailey will head the session, with many guest speakers including some Engineering Graduates. Groups will head over to the Mayfair, a local movie theatre that we've booked entirely for Engineering Frosh! 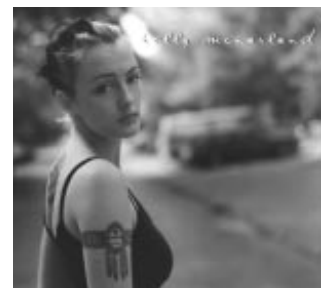

In previous years, Frosh groups have travelled to other Universities in Ontario and Quebec, and participated in a wide range of activities.

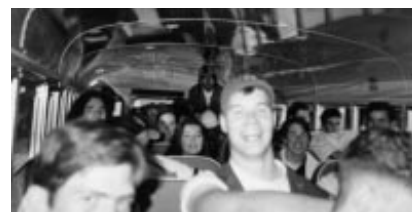

Note: Friday is the second day of regularly scheduled classes. Although Engineering labs do NOT start until Monday, Sept. 14th, Frosh are expected to attend all scheduled classes.

On Friday, the intensity is notched up a few levels, and we let our hair down. We'll meet in the MacKenzie Engineering Quad at 6 PM, and then we'll be bused downtown to the market for a late supper.



Dinner will be served in one of Ottawa's finest Market pubs, with a menu including true pub fare. The turnout for Friday's events is usually so incredible that Engineers virtually take over, sprawling out onto the patio and into neighbouring pubs.

The pub crawl will get started at about 8:30 PM. The Pub Crawl is aptly named, as all of the bars on our list are within walking distance of each other. We'll move from bar to bar throughout the night, visiting more than six or seven establishments before ending up in a mystery location.

Frosh will be bused back to the MacKenzie Engineering Quad starting at midnight and ending when the last Frosh is ready to go.

Saturday is an action-packed day with three major events planned: Market Skunt, the Dean's Supper and group boat-building. A late start is anticipated to ensure recovery from the Pub Crawl, although buses leave at 12:30 PM sharp!

Groups will meet at noon in the MacKenzie Engineering Quad. Buses will then take groups into the market for the afternoon activities. Market Skunt, an urban scavenger hunt in downtown Ottawa, is the ultimate in social interaction. You'll have to bargain with downtown proprietors for valuable Market Skunt items. Frosh are also assigned a number of other tasks to prove their resourcefulness and Engineering pride.

This display of Engineering pride has been unparalleled in the years since. Many years ago, Frosh hung a ten story, 100 foot sign down the side of Dunton Tower, a huge Arts building on campus. The Administration, Faculty, Students, and other Frosh groups were blown away by this incredible feat.



Once Market Skunt wraps up, the groups will proceed to the Dean's Supper. This is your first opportunity to meet and greet our Dean. The Dean of Engineering has always held a special place in our hearts, and is an invaluable resource for Engineering student projects and societies.

After supper, the groups will provide transportation to the individual group sites. At the sites, groups will build their boats for the traditional Boat Race. From the Bronson Bridge, the Rideau Canal stretches almost one kilometre to the Hartwell Locks at Carleton University. Groups will race against each other, but more importantly, against our rival Ottawa University. Boats must be built from scrounged materials, with a limit placed on the total cost of the materials, and emphasis is placed on boat design and construction.



If the group spot has appropriate facilities, groups are encouraged to sleep over at the site, and to then transport themselves and their boat to the MacKenzie Engineering Quad the next day.



SUNDAY, SEPT. 13

Sunday is the last day of Frosh week, and to wrap up EngFrosh '98, we're throwing a blow out bash so huge that we had to get a special city permit! Highlights of this super-secret party include free food, free brews, and free entertainment for all Frosh, Facils, and Leaders.



Sunday starts at noon in the MacKenzie Engineering Quad. Groups will bring their boats to be safety-checked by Mechanical Engineering Professors, and then over to the Hartwell Locks for the start of the boat race. Ottawa University will be in attendance (with real boats this year) to race against our groups.



The race is expected to last about an hour, and will start at 3 PM. Past Frosh have been World Dragonboat Medallists, Junior Olympic Canoers, and Olympic Paddlers, so Carleton usually kicks butt!



Each day of EngFrosh '98 the Frosh groups will be given one clue, and they'll have to figure out the answer somehow. On Sunday, you'll be given the last clue. If your group has gotten the right answers, the seven clues will result in a phone number where an answering machine will reveal the super-secret party location. It will also name another secret location where Frosh can meet to get transportation to and from the party. The party will go on all night, with live music, free food, free brews, and 500 of your fellow Frosh. We've taken care of everything, so expect to have an amazing time!

Today, celebrate the friends you've made during EngFrosh '98, friends who will be there for you throughout your academic career. Tomorrow classes will start, labs will begin, and you'll be swept away by the best years of your life.
