EVENT DETAILS:

Saturday, September 1st

Saturday is your first chance to sign-in (or register if you haven't done so yet) and get all set up for EngFrosh. The registration desk will be located somewhere within (or close to) the residence district of campus; the exact location will be announced soon but there will be signs posted regardless. We will be open throughout Residence Move-In, during which off-campus students are also encouraged to come sign in.

Sunday, September 2nd

Once again, we'll be doing registration and sign-in for both residence and off-campus students. That afternoon, Ye Olde EngFrosh kicks off with our opening ceremonies - this means that if you're moving in on the Sunday, be sure to move in early so you don't miss any of the action! This will be your first opportunity to meet the other people in your group, and get a glimpse of the craziness to come. That evening, you'll be participating in the campus-wide Ravenspalooza, which brings together first year students from all orientation programs.

Monday, September 3rd

Day 2 is the first full day of EngFrosh activities. You'll spend most of the day competing in the annual Eng-Games, where your group will have to use some creative thinking and some absurdity in order to come out on top. There will also be a not-so-average tour of campus to help you find your way around, and a tour of the city in double decker busses where you can see some of what Ottawa has to offer. The day ends off with an Engineering style Monte Carlo Night and a Concert showcasing Canadian talent.

Lunch and dinner are both provided.

Tuesday, September 4th

Day 3 is one of the major highlights of EngFrosh - White Water Rafting! You'll have the opportunity to go rafting on the Ottawa River with Wilderness Tours, a very popular and memorable experience. If you're feeling less adventurous, you can also opt to relax on the beach, play some volleyball or even just soak in the hot tub - all thanks to Wilderness Tours' many other facilities.

Wednesday, September 5th

Day 4 is mostly taken up by Academic Orientation, where you'll learn more about why you're here in the first place - school! In the evening, you'll return to EngFrosh to find out more about the social aspect of engineering at Carleton and all the various things you can do while you're here. Then, it's time for the Photo Skunt (short for Skavenger Hunt). Your group will have only a few hours to take the snapshots required on their lists. The catch? Those lists will contain abstract concepts and nonsense phrases. Have fun figuring out what to take pictures of!

Thursday, September 6th

Day 5 marks your first day of classes! To help you unwind after your first set of lectures, we will be marching over to the Mayfair Theatre for a night of movies and mayhem. Ever heckled a movie in a theatre - with 500 other people?

Friday, September 7th

Day 6 is more classes - unless you're lucky enough to have Fridays free on your schedule. Saturday, September 8th

Day 7 starts off with one of EngFrosh's most chaotic events - the annual Market Skunt! Your group will be armed with lists of things to find in Ottawa's Byward Market, but once again those lists will contain the strange and the confusing. Your group must design and construct a boat - right down to the paddles. Sunday, September 9th

Day 8 - this is it! The last day of EngFrosh begins with a pancake breakfast provided by the Carleton Student Engineering Society (CSES), while all of the boats undergo safety inspections. Once the inspections are complete, all of the boats will be transported to the Rideau Canal to start the annual Boat Race. Hours and hours of hard work will come together in a one-shot race for glory. Will your boat cruise to victory, or will its crew be forced to abandon ship? After the race, EngFrosh comes to a close with our awards ceremony, including most enthusiastic frosh and best overall group. Congratulations - you've survived your first week with Carleton Engineering!

REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

How to register in EngFrosh and join us for 8 days of great times and awesome activities:

Visit www.engfrosh.com, the official website of EngFrosh and click on the “REGISTER”. Follow the Registration Instructions explained on the EngFrosh 2007 Online Registration Form. If you are late registering (After August 23rd), there will be a minor extra fee charged. Online registration is preferred, please contact info@engfrosh.com if you cannot register online.

- Fill out all fields in the registration form.
- Once all information is correctly entered and satisfactory to you, click the “Register” button.
- If your registration was successfully received by the database, you will be provided with a printer friendly page. Please print this page.
- Print out the Wilderness Tours waiver and fill it out. This must be done, even if you are not going rafting. The form is legal sized, so please click “fit to page” when printing.
- Mail the registration printout, the Wilderness Tours waiver, and a cheque payable to EngFrosh 2007 to the following address:

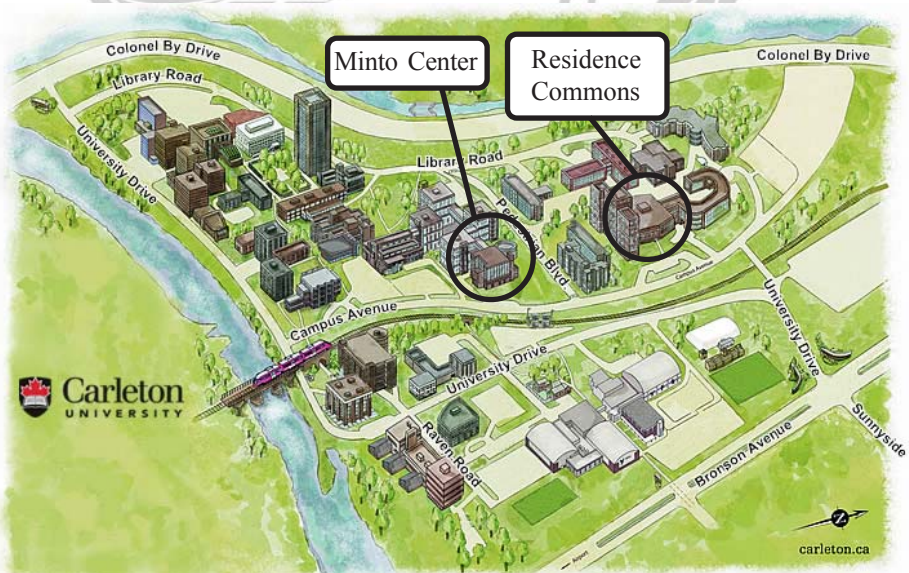

Note: Do not mail your forms and cheque to us after August 27th. Instead bring everything with you when you sign in for EngFrosh 2007, on either the Saturday or Sunday of Labour Day Weekend in Residence Commons.

- If your registration was not successfully received you will be told what went wrong, and prompted how to fix it if possible.

Show up on September 1st and 2nd at Residence Commons (see map) to sign in and get your frosh kit.

Tentatively the registration location is somewhere in or around the residence district. There will be plenty of signage. Please watch the website for more up-to-date information.

The Carleton Student Engineering Society, or CSES, has been serving the students of Carleton Engineering for more than 30 years. Its goal is to provide its members with academic, professional, and social resources to help them make it through their four (or more) years here at Carleton. CSES also represents Carleton Engineering in a variety of capacities, including the provincial and national levels of engineering student societies (ESSCO and CFES respectively). If you're an undergraduate student enrolled in a stream of engineering, you're a member of CSES. And if you're not, you're still more than welcome to attend our events and take part in our community!

CSES provides social events throughout the year, allowing engineering students to take a break from their studies and let loose. Some of the major events include EngFrosh, DUSTED (our rural outreach program), and Reflections (our annual awards and graduation formal). CSES also provides a wealth of services - Leonardo's Lounge (the engineering store), McCoy's study lounge, an equipment loan program, a monthly publication, the Student Group Resource Centre, and an exam library. We even have a textbook trade program, which helps new students get the textbooks they need from upper year students - for a fraction of the price!

All aspects of CSES are volunteer run, everything from CSES Council to EngFrosh. Even if you have no experience, there are plenty of opportunities to get involved. There are lots of volunteer positions that need filling, including official CSES Directorships. As well, an election will be held at the end of September to select two people to represent all first year engineering students on CSES Council.
